ANDY POTTS WINS 2011 ESCAPE FROM ALCATRAZ™ TRIATHLON -- HIS FOURTH TITLE

San Francisco – (June 5, 2011) More than 2,000 amateur and professional athletes competed in the 2011 Escape from Alcatraz™ Triathlon on Sunday, June 5, with Professional Triathlete Andy Potts from Colorado Springs, Colo. winning the prestigious event for the fourth time. First time participant Professional Triathlete Nicky Samuels from New Zealand was the top finisher among the females. Featuring a 1.5 mile swim from Alcatraz Island to the shore, an 18-mile bike ride and an eight-mile run through San Francisco, this race is considered one of the most difficult triathlons in the world. Pleasanton-based Safeway swept the corporate relay division taking first place across the board.
